Join the Challenge!

Choose one of two great ways to join kids from around the world to help break the world record for most minutes read during the summer.

Go to www.scholastic.com/bookfairs/record to get started.
Enter your reading minutes through August 31, 2010.

EASY OPTION

The easiest way to sign up for *Read for the World Record*.



SIGN UP

1. Click on the GO NOW! button to begin the easy 4-step process to sign up.
2. Click on the map to choose your state.
3. Enter Your Grade
4. Enter your school name. Once you start typing, school names will start appearing. Keep typing until your school name appears. It's important to click on the school name so it fills the box after you've stopped typing. If your school name doesn't appear, complete typing the name and click the "Add School Name" box.
5. Use the spinner to select a unique user name. Spin again until you get a name you like!
6. Be sure to write down or print your user name. There's no way to retrieve it once it's lost!

SIGN IN

For students who participated in Trial Runs or previously signed up for *Read for the World Record* through the "EASY OPTION" site, you can sign in here, there's no need to sign up again!

FULL OPTION

This more involved signup process provides additional activities beyond Read for the World Record.

1. Click on the GO NOW! button in the FULL OPTION box to begin the 5-step process to sign up.
 2. Click on "JOIN NOW." Note: Students will need to sign up even if they participated in Trial Runs.
 3. Enter your first name, First Letter of your last name, choose a screen name (you can use your Trial Run user name if you have one) and password. Finally, answer the security question and click "SAVE."
 4. Enter age and gender, but skip country--you get to enter that when you link to your school.
 5. Students choose a favorite book category from the following categories: Thrills & Chills, Friends & Fun, Fantasy & Adventure, or People & Places.
 6. Students have the option to enter a parent's e-mail address for permission to participate in the **full** Summer Challenge program experience.*
- *Note: All minutes that a child enters are submitted anonymously until parent/guardian permission is received. All minutes will still count toward the school total. Parent permission allows children to share book wish lists with friends, and allows parents to receive updates of their child's summer reading progress.
7. Students begin entering minutes for the *Read for the World Record* challenge.
 8. After minutes are entered, students are prompted to enter school information so minutes will count toward the school total.
